#### **REGULAR MEETING OF FEBRUARY 22, 2022**

Regular Meeting of the City Council was held remotely on Tuesday evening, February 22, 2022.

#### CALL TO ORDER

City Clerk Titi Siriphan called the meeting to order at 7:30 o'clock p.m.

#### CALL OF THE ROLL

City Clerk Titi Siriphan called the Roll of Members. Ten (10) Councillors were present including Councillor James Boone, Nathan Boudreau, Craig Cormier, Ronald Cormier, Aleksander Dernalowicz, Karen Hardern, Dana Heath, Elizabeth Kazinskas, George Tyros, and James Walsh. Councillor Judy Mack was absent.

#### **OPENING PRAYER**

President Kazinskas led the Council in reciting the Opening Prayer.

#### PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

President Kazinskas led the Council in reciting the "Pledge of Allegiance".

#### COMMUNICATIONS FROM THE MAYOR ORDERS

Reporting for the Finance Committee, Councillor Aleksander Dernalowicz informed the Council that #13009 from Free Cash to Police Department New Vehicle Account. The United States Department of the Treasury issued the Final Rule regarding the eligible uses for funded provided in the American Rescue Plan Act. It allowed uses of these funds to purchase emergency vehicles. In doing so, this would free up Free Cash that was appropriated for other uses by the City.

On a motion made by Councillor Aleksander Dernalowicz and seconded by Councillor Ronald Cormier, it was voted on call of the roll, ten (10) yeas, President Elizabeth Kazinskas; Councillors James Boone, Nathan Boudreau, Craig Cormier, Ronald Cormier, Aleksander Dernalowicz, Karen Hardern, Dana Heath, George Tyros, and James Walsh; that the following Order ought to pass:

AN ORDER RESCINDING ORDER No. 13009 APPROPRIATING A SUM OF MONEY FROM FREE CASH TO THE POLICE DEPARTMENT NEW VEHICLES ACCOUNT.

Best practice is to have these regulations updated every ten (10) years in order to make sure that existing regulations are in compliance with current state law. This appropriation request is to hire a consultant firm to work with Director Beauregard on updating our regulations that are overdue.

This project prepares the design, engineering, and permitting of a proposed 2.1 mile long, 12' wide paved shared-use path connecting downtown Gardner to Winchendon's center

On a motion made by Councillor Aleksander Dernalowicz and seconded by Councillor Ronald Cormier, it was voted on call of the roll, ten (10) yeas, President Elizabeth Kazinskas; Councillors James Boone, Nathan Boudreau, Craig Cormier, Ronald Cormier, Aleksander Dernalowicz, Karen Hardern, Dana Heath, George Tyros, and James Walsh; that the following Order ought to pass:

AN ORDER APPROPRIATING FROM FREE CASH TO MASS TRAIL GRANT MATCH ACCOUNT.

ORDERED: That there be and is hereby appropriated the sum of Forty Thousand Dollars and No Cents (\$40,000.00) from Free Cash to the Mass Trail Grant Match Account.

Reporting for the Finance Committee, Councillor Ronald Cormier informed the Council that the City Council voted to approve a transfer request of \$15,000.00 from the City's Termination Leave Account to the Scott Graves v. City of Gardner Lawsuit Account, since the City did not have certified free cash at the time to cover the expenses. This appropriation is to reimburse the Termination Leave account for the money that was transferred out of it.



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On a motion made by Councillor Ronald Cormier and seconded by Councillor Aleksander Dernalowicz, it was voted on call of the roll, ten (10) yeas, President Elizabeth Kazinskas; Councillors James Boone, Nathan Boudreau, Craig Cormier, Ronald Cormier, Aleksander Dernalowicz, Karen Hardern, Dana Heath, George Tyros, and James Walsh; that the following Order ought to pass:

AN ORDER APPROPRIATING FROM FREE CASH TO THE UNCLASSIFIED TERMINATION LEAVE ACCOUNT.

ORDERED: That there be and is hereby appropriated the sum of Fifteen Thousand Dollars and No Cents (\$15,000.00) from Free Cash to the Unclassified Termination Leave Account.

#### #10618

Reporting for the Finance Committee, Councillor Aleksander Dernalowicz informed the Council that at the August 2, 2021 meeting of the Gardner City Council, the Council voted to transfer the sum of \$15,000.00 for the City to defend itself in court. Those funds are now fully expended. This appropriation is to help cover the cost of the outstanding bills received to cover the cost of our representation moving forward. At this point, the state has been served as of October 2021 and they will be part of bearing the costs.

Councillor James Boone said that former Councillor Graves offered to drop the lawsuit if the requested documents were provided. He wanted the public to know that this is what this lawsuit is about. He said "This particular question in place involves the coils that have been damaged by questionably city water and a lot of residents have experienced this problem but yet there's been zero information as to why that happened. You guys represent the citizens and why doesn't anybody question why we don't have answers as to why these coils happen. I own buildings that have had this happen and talked to plumbers, talked to Wheelen Supply, which is no longer in business, I talked to the different plumbing supply houses, they refuse to actually give coils to people because they know there was a problem. Former Councillor Graves is just asking for the information for the people for the people of Gardner Massachusetts. With that said I know the city needs to defend itself against allegations but secondly, I don't understand why we are paying an outside counsel to have to defend this and it's surprising to me that you guys don't agree. You're representing the citizens of Gardner, Massachusetts."



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On a motion made by Councillor James Boone, seconded by Councillor Karen Hardern, to request written documentation from the City Solicitor as to why there is a conflict of interest for the City Solicitor to represent the City of Gardner in this lawsuit and use outside counsel.

It was voted on call of the roll, four (4) yeas, Councillors James Boone, Nathan Boudreau, Karen Hardern, and Dana Heath; six (6) nays, President Kazinskas and Councillors Craig Cormier, Ronald Cormier, Aleksander Dernalowicz, George Tyros, and James Walsh. This motion was defeated.

Councillor James Walsh spoke in opposition of this motion. He stated that this matter was addressed and discussed when the \$15,000.00 appropriation was first passed last fall and he thinks it was adequately discussed to his satisfaction. The lawsuit names the City Solicitor as a party defendant.

Councillor George also spoke in opposition of the motion and supports Councillor James Walsh's reason. He would like to point out that we have packets full of information that are delivered before each meeting because it is our responsibility to make informed decisions sitting in these seats. He wanted to clear up any confusion that we are not voting on just numbers. There are real descriptions included.

On a motion made by Councillor Aleksander Dernalowicz and seconded by Councillor Ronald Cormier, it was voted on call of the roll, six (6) yeas, President Elizabeth Kazinskas, Councillors Craig Cormier, Ronald Cormier, Aleksander Dernalowicz, George Tyros, and James Walsh; four (4) nays, Councillors James Boone, Nathan Boudreau, Karen Hardern, and Dana Heath; that the following Order ought to pass:

AN ORDER APPROPRIATING FROM FREE CASH TO THE S. GRAVES V CITY ET AL LAWSUIT ACCOUNT.

ORDERED: That there be and is hereby appropriated the sum of Five Thousand Dollars and No Cents (\$5,000.00) from Free Cash to the S. Graves et al Lawsuit Account.

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creation. Councillor Ronald Cormier was one of the Councillors who requested this audit and was happy to see the work and effort Chief Lagoy presented to the Committee.

On a motion made by Councillor Ronald Cormier and seconded by Councillor Aleksander Dernalowicz, it was voted on call of the roll, ten (10) yeas, President Elizabeth Kazinskas; Councillors James Boone, Nathan Boudreau, Craig Cormier, Ronald Cormier, Aleksander Dernalowicz, Karen Hardern, Dana Heath, George Tyros, and James Walsh; that the following Order ought to pass:

AN ORDER APPROPRIATING FROM FREE CASH TO SCHOOL ATHLETIC FIELD IMPROVEMENTS ACCOUNT.

ORDERED: That there be and is hereby appropriated the sum of One Hundred Twenty-One Thousand Nine Hundred Five Dollars and No Cents (\$121,905.00) from Free Cash to the School Athletic Field Improvements Account.

Councillor James Walsh does support the appropriation but would like to see the sources of the full funding will be coming from and what grants are being used.

Reporting for the Finance Committee, Councillor Aleksander Dernalowicz informed the Council that the Building Department currently uses a 2006 Ford Escape vehicle when traveling to different locations for inspectional services. The vehicle has come into disrepair and the foreman mechanic stated that the price of the repairs would be over the valuation of the vehicle. It will most likely not pass state inspection.

- It's good practice to review fees every five years



Dear Madam President and Councilors,

As you are aware, the Uptown Rotary Improvement Project is set to go out to bid this fall (likely in September), with construction beginning sometime next Spring (likely in April, depending on the weather).

The City received notice from the Massachusetts Department of Transportation (MassDOT) last week regarding additional title work that it is requiring for this project. A copy of the map they have provided us is attached.

While exempt from formal procurement laws, the City reached out to different Title Examiner Firms as to whether they would work on the project. Following this process, the City has been unable to find a firm that was either willing to take the project or lacked the resources and qualifications necessary to perform the work needed on this project. This project involves deeds that go back to the late 1800s, so the work is rather intensive.

However, until this work is completed, the City cannot move forwarded with obtaining the necessary appraisals needed for the permanent and temporary easements that are required for the project to begin.

Attorney Robert Charland has agreed to perform the work – limited to this project only-, however, this would require a legislative approval of a conflict of interest disclosure as he is currently an employee of Flick Law Group.

Again, as stated above, this would solely be limited to the work related to these specific deeds and not involving any long-term relationship or agreement with the City.

### FEE AGREEMENT REAL ESTATE TITLE WORK

I, Michael Nicholson, Mayor of the City of Gardner, by and on behalf of the City, with a business address of 95 Pleasant Street, Gardner, MA 01440, the "Client", hereby agree to retain FLICK LAW GROUP, P.C., ("FLG") to provide title services for real property purchases by the City of Gardner on the following terms and conditions.

WHEREAS, the City is engaged in a public works project which will require the permanent and temporary taking of various parcels of land around the uptown rotary;

WHEREAS, the project requires the City to obtain title examinations of City owned property which requires examination of titles dating into the 1800's, and several parcels which are currently owner unknown; and

WHEREAS, the title examiner used by the City's Law Department is unwilling to perform such titles;

NOW THEREFORE, the City and FLG agree as follows:

Given the complexity of the titles to be examined, FLG shall be paid hourly for all work performed to complete such title examinations at the hourly rate of \$200.00 an hour. All work will be performed by FLG's title counsel, Attorney Robert Charland. Work performed by paralegals employed by FLG will be compensated at a rate of \$125.00 per hour.

All title work to be performed by FLG pursuant to this Agreement shall be limited to the following parcels as shown on Exhibit A:

- E-9
- TE-02
- Owner Unknown, 28 Green Street
- E-6
- TE-08

In addition, FLG shall be entitled to reimbursement for all reasonable out of pocket costs including but not limited to title insurance premiums, recording fees, tax stamps, and overnight or wire fees, if any.

All services provided shall be in accordance with this Agreement. FLG agrees to provide legal services in connection with the above matter and to keep the Client fully informed of all significant developments, and to send copies of relevant documents necessary to achieve that purpose.

Please note these fees do not include work necessary to resolve potential title issues, which may appear during a title search of the property. Should the title report indicate items that need to be resolved in order to provide the City with a "clean title", the responsibility of performing such work shall be the seller or donor's responsibility. If the City elects to assist with the resolution of title, such work will be performed by the City's Law Department. The City agrees to pay for all other costs incurred and out-of-pocket disbursements made by FLG, to clear any title issues, including, but not limited to, ordering certified/notarized documents, recording fees, and postage/next day delivery fees.

If the Client discharges the FLG, or in the event the FLG decides to terminate the representation of the Client, the FLG shall be paid for all work performed to the point of termination of services, and this payment shall include all services which have been completed, as well as reimbursement of costs expended up to the time of termination of the relationship.

NOTE: John M. Flick, Esq., the Principal shareholder of FLG also serves as City Solicitor of the City of Gardner. In this capacity, by classification of his position with the City, Attorney Flick is permitted to have private employment during normal business hours.

This Agreement is subject to the City Council approving a Disclosure of Special Municipal Employee of Financial Interest in a Municipal Contract as Required by G.L. c. 268A, § 20(d).





A recent review of the Golf Course personnel and their respective pay rates brought an oversight to both mine and Golf Superintendent, William Frank's attention. Wesley Murphy has been employed by the Golf Course as a Motor Equipment Repairman since September 21, 2017. Pursuant to City ordinance, Mr. Murphy received a pay increase on March 21, 2018 (six (6) months after his date of hire) and was moved to Step 2 of the compensation schedule. Mr. Murphy should have received another pay increase on March 21, 2019 and been moved to Step 3 of the compensation schedule. As of the date of our review he had not been moved to Step 3 of the compensation schedule. As such, please note the following rate changes that need to be implemented for Mr. Murphy:

Date	New Rate
March 21, 2019	\$19.76
July 1, 2019	\$20.16
July 1, 2020	\$20.56
July 1, 2021	\$21.07

Mr. Murphy has been moved to the appropriate step 3 rate as of this week. We will process a retro-payment for him totaling \$3,083.06 back to July 1, 2021 in next week's payroll. The remaining retro pay for 2019 and 2020 totals \$9,225.75 and requires City Council approval as it covers two previous fiscal periods. Pursuant to my discussion with the City Auditor, John Richard, the retro-compensation will have to be paid out of the Golf Course enterprise fund.

Attached is a copy of the pay change forms for Mr. Murphy with the attached retro calculations which I believe you will want to discuss at your next Golf Commission meeting and prior to our submission to the City Council.

The fund that was previously set up to maintain and monitor the former landfill will be all but exhausted by the end of the fiscal year. In order to maintain and monitor the landfill going forward, I am requesting the transfer of \$75,000 from Free Cash to the Landfill Closure Fund.

I anticipate this will be an annual request to replenish the account. We anticipate the cost to maintain and monitor the former landfill will be approximately \$50,000 a year. By adding \$75,000 a year for the next twelve (12) years, we anticipate we will be able to re-establish a small cushion for the fund. Dear Madam President and Councilors,

As you are aware, the City did a lot last year in terms of repairing and improving our water infrastructure throughout the City in replacing old pipes, main lines, and valves that were installed between 1880 and 1930.

Part of the original loan that was taken from the water enterprise account was to be used to pave all of the streets where work was done. This is an approved use of enterprise funds by the Department of Revenue, due to its direct relation with the work being done underneath the surface of the streets.

However, due to the large increases in the cost of asphalt due to the pandemic and the Russian invasion of Ukraine, the original loan is not sufficient to cover these costs.

Attached is a request for an additional \$1.8 million to be borrowed from the water enterprise account in order to complete this project.

This is still within our debt limit for the enterprise account and will not require any rate changes for those utilizing City water services.




Given the current Rate Structure, we are anticipating rates will not have to be increased until approximately FY2025 *unless other projects are undertaken*. We have created a spreadsheet and graph of the water and sewer systems. The spreadsheets include all know costs to the Enterprise Systems and estimated loan repayment schedules. There are several water and sewer projects that we anticipate will need to be completed within the next 5-7 years that will impact the rate structure in the future. These projects are NOT shown on the graph below.



If this loan is approved, it will still leave several streets in the Wickman/Robillard area that will not be resurfaced by Water Department funds. Below is a plan of the Robillard/Wickman area. The streets with the blue lines will be resurfaced by the Water Department. The streets with the red lines will need to be resurfaced with City/Chapter 90 funds. The green lines are sidewalks that will also need to be paid for by the City/Chapter 90.

I will be working with the Mayor and City Council to acquire the nearly \$1.3 million in funding for the remaining portion of this project shown with the red lines and adjacent sidewalks.

It should be noted that asphalt costs will most likely increase making paving estimates very difficult in this volatile market.





### **Casey Bradshaw- Alternate Plumbing and Gas Inspector (New Appointment)**

- Mr Bradshaw is the current full time Plumbing Inspector for the Town of Orange. He has all of his certifications from the Commonwealth and has been performing work in this field for quite sometime. This is an as needed position but per the Commonwealth's Building Code, must still have an active appointment in order to have the authority to issue citations or inspection certifications. This came following the resignation of or previous Alternate Inspector Edward Tonet. This appointment comes at the recommendation of Commission Jean who would be the Department Head overseeing this work. This is an hourly paid, Unbenefited position.

### **Airport Commission (Re-Appointments)**

### - Philip Morrissey, James Morrissey, John LaVoie, Andre Guertin

- These are all reappointment sod individuals who have served in their capacities as Airport Commissioners for a few decades. They have continued to have interests in seeing the airport succeed, particularly with the new several million dollar grant the airport just received from the FAA as part of the Infrastructure Bill competitive funding.

### Stephen Hirons- Sealer of Weights and Measurers (Re-Appointment)

- Mr Hirons has worked in this position for over a decade and his father held the position prior to him.
