

#### **FOOD**

of foods: seeds, grains, garbage, pet food, fallen fruits, nuts, and compost



Rats only require roughly 0.5 ounces of water a day, and will drink from standing water sources or leaks in pipes or faucets

#### SHELTER

Rats often live in underground burrows but can find shelter in lumber on the ground, shrubbery and grasses rubbish, abandoned vehicles and

There has been an overall uptick in rodent populations in Massachusetts, but working together with your community can help to reduce these numbers.

- Routinely check for evidence of burrows, droppings, gnaw
- and rub marks, tracks, nests, and hidden food stashes

  Use rodent-proof containers with tight-fitting lids for all trash, and keep areas around trash and dumpsters clean

  Seal all holes and cracks. Both rats and mice may get through holes as small as a dime
