

Senior Housing Project - The Senior Housing project is progressing. The majority of the framing is done and the fire protection contractor has started to install the sprinkler system piping. Over the past few months the duty crews have been building aoina through the as it progresses. This is an important time for firefighters to be able to see the construction of the building and see how the systems are laid out before the sheetrock is installed.



Burning With Open Ban the unseasonably dry conditions we have faced over the past few weeks we have banned all outdoor open burning. Throughout the state there are numerous 100+ acre brush fires and many smaller fires. One thing we can do is limit human factors that contribute to brush fires. The ban will be lifted once it is safe to do so.





Matthew Amendola – Congratulations to Matt Amendola for graduating from the Call/Vol Recruit Firefighter Training Class 114 Thursday evening. His class consisted of 25 firefighters from around the state. Congratulations Matt!!



New Forestry Truck - This week we received delivery of our new Forestry truck. This truck replaces Engine 5 which is a 2007 and at end of life. The new vehicle was built to fight forest fires which often can be in areas that are inaccessible to our larger apparatus. It is built on a Ford F-450 cab/chassis that was upfitted with a lift kit and super single tires, carries 200 gallons of water with a 315 GPM pump and has some compartments to carry hose and hand tools.



Drought Conditions – We continue to see drought conditions that are conducive to rapid growth of brush fires. There have been numerous 100+ acre brush fires throughout the state.

Town Hall Little Art Gallery - Bren Bataclan



"I like to make people smile - that's why I give away acrylic painting with whimsical characters. My kindnessrelated street art project let me to work with schools where I feel so fortunate to be able to collaborate with students, incorporating their work into large scale murals. I didn't expect to become a muralist but I am loving it. Lastly, I explore Filipino-related subjects in my more personal work. Expressing my cultural background through my artwork is one of my passions."







Bren Bataclan is a Boston-based artist...

He was born in the Philippines and grew up in Daly City/Bay Area, CA. Prior to becoming a fulltime artist, Bren taught design and computer animation at the University or Massachusetts Amherst and the Boston Museum School. In the early 2000s, Bren began giving away paintings in public spaces with a note saying, "This painting is yours if you promise to smile at random people more often." Since then, he has given away close to 4,000 paintings in over 100 countries and to all 50 states in the US. As anti-bullying programs gained popularity, schools began to ask Bren to give presentations about his kindness-related street art project.







His "Pay-it-forward" themed presentations led to mural projects. Bren has now painted over 300 murals for hospitals, businesses and schools (including Westminster and Meetinghouse School here ins Town).

The cartoon-like characters Bren draws are inspired by his days watching "Giant Robot" Anime shows when he was a kid in Manila. The color scheme he uses for his acrylic-based painting is what he used to see growing up in a tropical, festive and vibrant community. Bren now qoes beyond his painting qiveaways. He currently delves deeper into his Filipino culture, both personally and politically. Since a recent spate of "Super Storms" in his homeland. Bren has created a series of typhoon-related artwork to heighten Global Warming awareness and to raise funds for storm victims. His newer works deal with his immigration experience.

Bren has exhibited his work across the country. Heinemann Press also published an elementary school textbook entitled "The Smile Artist," about his artwork. In 2017 he gave a TEDx Talk about his street art project. In 2021, Bren's book, Fe: A Traumatized Son's Graphic Memoir, was published by PAWA. In 2022, he became and Artist Fellow with the Cultural Diplomacy initiative at the Fletcher School of Law & Diplomacy at Tufts University.

Bren received his BA in design at UCLA and his MA in computer animation at Ohio State University.

Westminster's Senior Center serves as a vital gathering space and resource hub for senior residents. As head of this active center, the Director of Elder Services will be responsible for utilizing a \$16,000 annual programming budget to create diverse, engaging programs that support community-building, health, wellness, and lifelong learning for Westminster's seniors. Town Fuel Assistance Apps will be available at the Senior Center as of December 1st!

The Westminster Select Board has instituted an Emergency Home Heating Assistance Program (EHHAP) for eligible Westminster residents. Funding for the program is

provided from monies available in the Fred Smith Poor Fund as well as the Giles Fund. To be eligible, residents must have lived in Town for the past six months or longer and must meet income eligibility guidelines established by the most recent HUD low-income limits for the Westminster area. Once approved, applicants are able to receive a benefit once during the 2024-2025 season. The EHHAP will be administered through the Emergency Home Heating Committee, appointed by the Select Board. Information provided will be kept confidential.
