Fall/Winter Sports Exhibit 1-4 pm - no reservation needed

The exhibit features displays of area high school sports (GHS, Murdock, Narragansett, Oakmont), the Dubzinski Family, and Greater Gardner Area professional athletes & Olympians. Sports Cheats 7-8 pm after a museum-hosted reception at 6:30 pm

You asked—and we got him back! After his popular presentation in Sept 2024, author Bob Ainsworth returns with *Sports Cheats, Frauds, and Con Artists*, coinciding with the museum's Fall/Winter Sports Exhibit. From Bill Belichick and Spygate to Tom Brady and Deflategate, Nancy Kerrigan's attack by Tonya Harding, and Alex Cora's sign-stealing scandal, Bob explores infamous moments when athletes and coaches broke the rules to win. Cheating, he reveals, isn't limited to major sports—it happens everywhere people compete, from fencing and chess to the Olympics and even the Special Olympics. Tracing cheats and scandals from ancient times to today, Bob shares stories both familiar and surprising—entertaining, amazing, and shocking audiences with tales of winning at any cost.

Sep 11 Faith, Family & Heritage: A Writers Journey 7-8 pm after a museum-hosted reception at 6:30 pm Join us for an evening with author Tim Crellin, Episcopal priest and Rector of St. Paul's Church since 2022. Raised in the Boston area and educated at Brown and Harvard Divinity School, Tim drew on his Sicilian heritage and deep study of 20th-century wars to craft his historical novel *The Land of the Living*. The book follows Angela and Tommaso Amorelli from Ellis Island to a New England fishing town, exploring immigration, identity, war, and family resilience. Tim will share how his family history and study of war inspired the story, offering a personal look at the experiences behind the novel. Signed copies of the book will be available for purchase.

Unveiling Harrison Cady 3 pm - no reservation needed

The Gardner Museum invites the community to the official Sunday celebration of the new permanent exhibit honoring Harrison Cady (1877–1970), Gardner's most famous native son and a leading illustrator of the Golden Age of Illustration. Best known for his *Peter Rabbit* drawings in Thornton Burgess's children's books, Cady also created satirical magazine illustrations and later became a skilled landscape painter. The exhibit showcases 21 works, including the newly conserved watercolor *Cady's Store at*

Gardner Center, Mass. Anno Domini, 1885. The event will include a ribbon cutting, remarks, and a special raffle as we honor the remarkable legacy that began right here in our city.

Madness in Crowds 7-8 pm after a museum-hosted reception at 6:30 pm

Harrison Cady, born in Gardner in 1877, was a prominent cartoonist, illustrator, and author from the late 1890's into the 1960's. (Did you know he designed our city seal?) Though once famous for *Peter Rabbit* and his collaborations with Thornton Burgess, Cady was largely forgotten until the 2020 publication of *Madness in Crowds: The Teeming Mind of Harrison Cady*. Co-written by Denis and Violet Kitchen, the book won a national design award and was nominated for two Eisner Awards. The father-daughter duo gave a wonderful presentation about the book here at the museum in October 2019. Now Denis, himself a longtime cartoonist, author, and publisher, returns with a visual lecture on Cady's remarkable career. Copies of the book, and special 3-D prints of selected Cady images will be available for purchase.

Winemaker Matt Denette Sr. will give a presentation about family-owned Averill House Vineyard, the first full production grape-to-glass winery located inside the Historic Ice District of Brookline, NH. He will also delve into the topic of wine-glass pairing, exploring the key factors to consider and providing guidance on which wines pair best with which glass types: Glass shape, size, and material can impact the overall drinking experience: it can enhance or detract from the flavors, aromas, and textures. Due to the city's licensing requirements, no wine will be sampled tonight.
