




Re-Dedication of Fire/Police Monuments – Thank you to all of those who helped with the monument move over the past few weeks. The DPW assisted us with pouring the foundations and moving the monuments. Randy and Marty spent quite a bit of time working to clean the monuments and painting of the area. The firefighters on shift were able to cut in the bed, install the edging and mulch. This consolidated the fire and police monuments into a visible location to honor the work these individuals do on a daily basis.

This Saturday July 12th we will have a re-dedication ceremony for the monuments and invite all members both present and previous to the station for the event. We will have some brief remarks at the monuments and take a group photo to commemorate the event, light refreshments will be served.







200th Ceremony - Saturday the department held the 200th Anniversary Ceremony and Rededication of the Fire and Police Monuments. Thank you to all past and present members who attended the event.

Handtub Muster - On August 16th we will be hosting a hand tub muster which will be held at the Westminster Elementary School as part of our continuing 200th Anniversary celebration. This will be a great event and pays homage to the history of the fire service. Prior to motorized apparatus hand tubs were the means firefighters used to pump water to extinguish fires.

In the United States Hand Tubs began to gain prominence in the 1700's with Boston acquiring their first, hand tub in 1721. As time went on, larger cities began to switch to steam powered fire apparatus, later motorize apparatus; but in rural areas hand tubs remained in service into the early 1900's. In the United States there were a few major manufactures such as the Hunneman and Company, Button Fire Engine Works and Perkins and Company who produced hand tubs.

Our "Always Ready" was purchased by the Town in 1849 and was produced by the Hunneman and Company. It was the 376th hand tub produced by them out of a total of 716 built in Revere. It served in the Narrows Road area, later on South St before being moved to Main St where it remained in service into the early 1900's. It was eventually replaced by the first motorized fire engine when it was purchased by the Firefighters Association where it remains today.

In 2006 it was meticulously restored by Lt. Clay Swenor to its original condition and is still capable of operating today. William Hunneman founded the company in 1792 which produced hand tubs up to 1883. He apprenticed and worked for none other than Paul Revere learning the metalsmith trade. This is an iconic piece of fire service history and will be on display this weekend at our 200th Ceremony.

To put into perspective when the Westminster Fire Department was founded there was a total of 24 States in the Union and the Westward Expansion was in full swing. It would be 36 years after the founding of the department before the American Civil War broke out. The Boston Fire Department is generally considered the oldest Fire Department in the country being founded in 1678. Outside of larger municipal fire departments Westminster is generally accepted as being one of the 15th oldest organized volunteer fire companies in the United States.













Parks and Rec Water Day - Thursday afternoon we were able to participate in the Parks and Rec Water Day. Firefighters bring one of the trucks over and set up a hose stream, ultimately, we win the water gun fight every year! This is an amazing tradition for the Parks & Rec Summer Program! The kids look forward to it every year as part of the Water Week program!





E-Bike Fire – On Thursday afternoon Engine 1 was dispatched to an address on Bathrick Rd for an E-Bike on fire in the driveway. El arrived and found the bike well involved in the driveway and extinguished the fire. With the popularity of electric powered bikes and scooters there are risks involved, see the attached flyer from the NFPA for more info.

Here in Massachusetts we have seen an increase in battery fires. The following video was collected from Onset. It is a good video that shows how quickly these fires develop and the amount of toxic smoke that is produced. WATCH: Fire erupts at Onset hobby shop, likely caused by lithium-ion batteries



The popularity of electric bikes and electric scooters (e-bikes and e-scooters) has taken off over the past few years. Lithium-ion batteries are usually the source of power for both, and if not used correctly, or if damaged, those batteries can catch on fire or explode. Whether you use e-bikes or e-scooters as your main way of getting around, or just for fun, there are important safety tips to keep in mind when charging or storing these devices.

The Problem

- Damaged or defective batteries can overheat, catch fire, or explode.
- Lithium-ion battery fires give off toxic gases and they burn extremely hot.

- · Only purchase and use devices, batteries, and charging equipment that are listed by a nationally recognized testing lab and labeled accordingly.
- Always follow the instructions from the manufacturer.
- Only use the battery and the charger that were designed for, and came with, the device. Do not keep charging the device or device
- battery after it is fully charged.
- Only charge one device or device battery at a time to prevent overloading the circuit.
- Keep batteries at room temperature when possible. Do not charge them at temperatures below 32°F (0°C) or above 105°F
- Do not store batteries in direct sunlight or inside hot vehicles, and keep them away from children and liquids.

- Store e-bikes, e-scooters, and batteries away from exit doors and anything that can get hot or catch fire.
- Only have device repairs performed by a qualified professional.
- Do not put lithium-ion batteries in the trash. Recycling is always the best option. Take the batteries to a battery recycling location or contact your local waste department for disposal instructions.

Signs of a Problem

Stop using the e-bike or e-scooter if you notice any of these problems with the battery: unusual odor, change in color, too much heat, change in shape, leaking, smoking, or not keeping a charge.










