




December's cold temperatures have caused many local ponds and waterways to freeze over, but appearances can be deceiving. Even during sustained cold weather, underice water flow and other factors can greatly affect how strong the ice truly is. The guide to the left offers helpful insight into ice safety and outlines when certain activities may be considered safer.



The most important rule to remember: if you have any doubt about ice thickness, play it safe and stay off the ice. Cracks, open water, or visible movement underneath are clear warning signs—steer clear. Our safety departments are always ready to respond in an emergency, but the best protection is avoiding a dangerous situation altogether. Stay safe and use caution this winter.







At a recent meeting of the **Westminster Emergency Management Agency**, we reviewed emergency sheltering. The team inspected cots and blankets, pet crates, medical supplies along with personal hygiene supplies. If the need arises, your emergency management is ready to respond.



There are currently 5 FREE LIBRARIES in town. In addition to Knower, there are Lighthouse Lane, Bacon Street Farmstand, Davis Road and Fenno Drive! Anyone looking for additional locations, can use the Little Free Library App (details: https://littlefreelibrary.org/app/). Or for Blockbuster box locations, go to freeblockbuster.org. Knower Road is currently the only location in Westminster.

Owner of the Knower Road location, Chris Hoey says, "Mine started out of my wife's love of reading and the Free Blockbuster started out of my affinity for Movies. It is a fun kind of passive hobby for us where I will keep an eye out for books and media to add and it's fun to see what gets taken and what gets donated! Each library is unique in design and what is stocked. We usually try to keep a steady flow of crime novels in ours. While others have added great kids specific Library's like Lighthouse Lane recently did." His advice, "If people have newer popular books they are done with, please donate them to the free library's around town!"

Medicinal Compost Spreading at Academy Hill

Recently, a dedicated group of patrons-supported by compost generously provided by The Good Earth Farm & Garden Centerspread more than 15 yards of compost around several trees to promote their health, maintenance, and growth. This treatment follows the same proven process used six years ago that helped save many of the Academy Hill trees. Consecutive years of drought had weakened the trees, making re-treatment the best option to ensure their continued vitality and resilience.

The special compost "recipe" included more than 15 yards of aged wood chips, ground tree roots, and shredded leaves, enhanced with the following additions:

• Azomite: 220 lbs

• Alfalfa meal: 350 lbs

Chick Grower: 100 lbs

• Gypsum: 280 lbs

Solucal (calcium and carbon):
 200 lbs

• NCO Pro Grow: 200 lbs

Town Fuel Assistance Apps will be available at the Senior Center and Town website as of December 1st!

The Westminster Select Board has instituted an Emergency Home Heating Assistance Program (EHHAP) for eligible Westminster residents. Funding for the program is provided from monies available in the Fred Smith Poor Fund as well as the Giles Fund. To be eligible, residents must have lived in Town for the past six months or longer and must meet income eligibility guidelines established by the most recent HUD lowincome limits for the Westminster area. Applicants are able to receive a benefit once during the season.

The EHHAP will be administered through the Emergency Home Heating Assistance Committee, appointed by the Select Board. Information provided will be kept confidential.




SKI CLUB STARTS ON WEDNESDAY, JANUARY 7TH!
